Bock Farm Community Meeting



On January 26, Supervisor Dan Storck hosted a community presentation about the proposed changes being considered for Bock Farm, located at 2405 Parkers Lane. The meeting was held in the Lecture Hall at Walt Whitman Middle School.

The initial Bock Farm application to rezone and develop about 40% of the farm's 11.4 acres, with no zoning changes to the remaining 60%, was considered by area groups during the first half of 2016. A Fairfax County Planning Commission public hearing was held on July 13, 2016 where the application passed unanimously. The Board of Supervisors public hearing was held on Sept 20, 2016, after which Supervisor Storck ultimately deferred a decision on the original application until February 14, 2017, to provide more time to respond to community concerns and consider other options. Since the September meeting, Supervisor Storck has held several meetings with area residents, the Bock family and the developer Joe Francone to answer questions and identify other potential options. Three options are being discussed:

1. Proceed with the original application for senior 55+ age community proposal with four, four-story buildings with 128 units;

2. Senior 55+ age community proposal modified with lower building heights and approximately 5-10 fewer units; or

3. Townhomes with 35-40 units, not age restricted.

While these options are being discussed, no decisions have been made or will be until the Board of Supervisors consideration on February 14.

With the leaves off of the trees, you may start to notice construction materials, appliances, tires, equipment, furniture, tarp and canvas covered items, or other random outdoor storage items on properties near your home.

Article 10-102 of the Fairfax County Zoning Ordinance regulates the size and



location of outdoor storage. If items are excessive or located improperly on the lot, the Department of Code Compliance can issue a Notice of Violation to have items removed. Learn more...

Tour de Mount Vernon

Thanks to the dozens of cyclists who came out on New Year's Eve for the inaugural "Tour de Mount Vernon" bike ride. The informal bike ride began at Belle Haven Park on the George Washington Parkway (GWP). The 25 mile one-way or 50 mile round-trip ride follows the GWP trail to Mount Vernon Estate and continues on ultimately ending at the Workhouse Arts Center.

Supervisor Storck organized and led the first Tour de Mount Vernon magisterial cross-district spanning bike ride, while highlighting many of our district assets - the GW Parkway, Mount Vernon Estate, Grist Mill, Woodlawn, Fort Belvoir, the Cross County Trail and the Workhouse Arts Center.

Supervisor Storck, a cycling and outdoors enthusiast, was encouraged by the turnout and intends to use this first Tour de Mount Vernon as a learning experience for engaging more of the community and scheduling similar rides in the future.

Chairman Bulova Seeks Applicants for New Land Use Community Council

Beginning in February, Sharon Bulova, Chairman of the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors, will be convening a Community Council tasked with identifying ways to enhance and improve community engagement during the process of planning and land development in Fairfax County. Council meetings will begin with a review of planning and zoning as it evolved from the early years of the county to the present. It will conclude with the adoption of a slate of recommendations for how the County can best involve interested and/or affected residents

when land use changes are being considered.

The Community Council will meet on approximately four or five Monday evenings at 7:30 p.m. at the Fairfax County Government Center. No previous experience with land use issues is required. Individuals with a background in communications or interest in community issues are also welcome. Chairman Bulova is looking for one or two individuals from each district. Next CERT Training Class Announced



Community Emergency Response Team (CERT), is a FREE training program that prepares residents to help themselves, their families and neighbors in the event of a disaster in their community.

CERT BASIC TRAINING CLASS (121) at the Fire and Rescue Academy

March 6, 8, 13, 15, 20, 22, 27, 29, 2017. Mondays and Wednesdays.

This training class follows the FEMA curriculum, and is tailored to local disasters and hazards. Educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Emphasis on hands-on skill development and Fairfax County protocols and procedures. Instructor will provide syllabus with class schedule at first session. This training does not require any special physical strength or agility. You must attend all 8 sessions to receive a certificate.
