- Tailgating

- · Running red lights and stop signs

This summer, the Fairfax County Police Department will be targeting aggressive and unsafe drivers along the Richmond Highway corridor. You can help by reporting aggressive drivers



What can I do to reduce the chance of being labeled an aggressive driver?

- · Allow plenty of travel time
- Maintain an adequate distance from the vehicle in front of you
- Always used turn signals
- Always come to a full stop at red lights and stop signs
- · Don't run yellow lights: slow down instead
- Let other drivers merge with you
- · Focus on driving; limit cell phone and stereo use

- Use horn only for emergencies
- Never engage in rude faces/gestures with other drivers/motorists
- Extend common courtesy to other drivers at all times

Back to the Bay



I was honored to attend and speak at the Back to the Bay event on Saturday, June 10th at Mason Neck State Park. It is because of the Chesapeake Bay Preservation Act, the Clean Water Act and other intelligent environmental regulations government has put in place that the Chesapeake Bay, Potomac River and our watersheds are improving. This family friendly event celebrates the nation's largest estuary, the Chesapeake Bay.

There are four easy ways you can help protect the health of the Bay.

- 1). Participate in a local watershed clean up event.
- 2). Use lawn fertilizers sparingly, the excess phosporus can cause algae blooms, robing aquatic life of oxygen.
- 3). Install a rain barrel at your home
- 4). Scoop the poop don't let pet waste enter our watersheds; up to a third of harmful bacteria can come from dog waste.

Summer Pet Safety

The sizzling temperatures are here! Do not leave your pets in your car, even for a few minutes. In June to September of last year we had 22 confirmed cases of dogs left in cars in Fairfax County, including one death.



Rolling down the windows has little effect on the temperature inside a car. High temps can cause organ damage and even death for our furry friends. Call 9-1-1 if you see a pet alone in a parked car on a hot day.

Pet owners are urged to remember the following tips:

On a warm day, temperatures can rapidly rise to dangerous levels. If you see an animal in distress in a parked car, contact police. Even with the windows slightly open, the temperature in a car on a 93-degree day can soar to 125 degrees in just 20 minutes and approximately 140 degrees in 40 minutes.

If your pet shows any of the following signs contact your veterinarian immediately:

- heavy panting
- glazed eyes
- rapid heartbeat
- vomiting
- fever
- dizziness
- restlessness
- excessive thirst
- profuse salivation

Take steps to reduce the animal's body temperature; apply ice packs or cold towels to the head, neck and chest, provide water and ice cubes for hydration, and move the animal into the shade or air-conditioning.
