HHS began this journey by identifying the results that we seek for individuals, families, and communities


HHS planning tools are intentionally aligned with these results


The HHS Report Card

The HHS Action Plan

Purpose: Outlines strategies and key action steps to address needs and challenges

Other Key Factors:

- Prioritizes work across the system
 - Nearly 60 existing strategies
 - The action plan facilitates a realistic phased approach
- Monitors implementation and impact of strategies

The HHS Resource Plan

Purpose: Aligns resources to needs, strategies, and action steps

Other Key Factors:

- Based on FY 2018 and FY 2019 Budget Guidance
- Linked to the 2016 Human Services Needs Assessment
- Endorsed by the Human Services Council
- Living plan, built to be flexible
 - Identifies priority funding needs
 - Initial plan includes three fiscal years
 - Identifies need, program, staffing, and costs



The tools work together to ...

- Guide decisions at various levels across the system
- Measure our impact and determine necessary adjustments
- Forecast and plan for the future
- Facilitate transparency and communication with community and stakeholders
