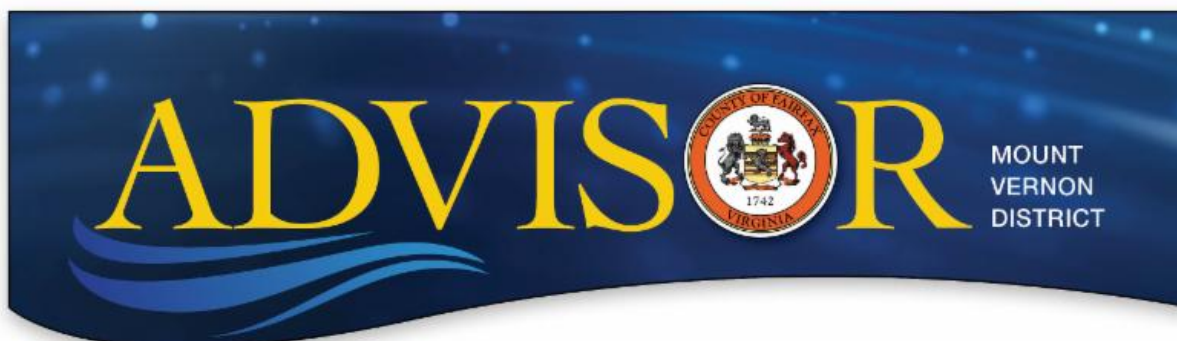

Neighbors,

I know many of you are working from home, while **supporting your students and younger children**. The announcement that Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS) will **start all-virtually in September** is creating a **huge burden on our parents** to be employees, teachers, hall monitors, day care providers, coaches and cafeteria workers. This is why the County is working to **create additional options** for you.



Those options include **extending in-person Camp Fairfax** to August 14 and **reopening a modified School Aged Child Care (SACC) program** in the fall. More details on SACC will be coming this month.

The **County's Office for Children** is working with **private childcare providers** to ensure they have the **information and resources** they need to open and operate safely. **Grants and financial assistance are available** through the County, as well.

While many want our children to **return to in-person classrooms**, the School Board has decided to start schools virtually for **safety and to prevent community spread**. Superintendent Brabrand has committed to **revisiting this decision in October** and **Mount Vernon School Board Member Karen Corbett Sanders** has requested that the Superintendent share metrics by which he will **pivot to in-person learning and plans** for bringing our most vulnerable populations back to school as soon as possible. In the interim, FCPS has **invested in technology, digital curriculum and professional development** which should make the **experience in the fall different** than what families experienced in the spring. Additionally, teaching staff will continue to **work full time providing instruction** to all of our students. [Learn more about Back To School...](#)

The County is also focused on **several other priorities** to help **all in our communities**, from public safety to job creation. We continue to **implement One Fairfax and Diversion First** to promote equity and equality for all, including standing up a **Task Force on Equity and Opportunity**. In the past two weeks, we **broke ground on two important projects** for the Richmond Highway corridor. **The Arden** will provide **126 affordable housing units** and the **Residences at North Hill** will provide **216 affordable family apartments and 63 affordable independent senior units**, in addition to market rate townhomes and a **12-acre park**. Both projects represent a **significant County investment** in homes for all along the income spectrum in our neighborhoods. These multi-year construction projects will **provide many good local jobs**.

Later this month, we will break ground on the **new Lorton Community Center and Library**. This new center will combine **vital community and neighborhood services** to enrich a previously under-served residential area. **Please join us on Saturday, August 22 at 10 a.m., either in-person or virtually, for the official ceremony!**

As we start to rebound out of the COVID-19 pandemic, the **County is committed to helping all** in our community through streamlining County operations, **supporting local jobs and businesses**, creating **additional child development opportunities** so parents can get back to work, supporting our schools and students, and **providing healthy and quality housing opportunities** for all. **We will leave no one behind!**

Centennial Celebration of Women's Right to Vote



As we prepare for the **100th anniversary of women's right to vote on August 26, 2020**, we want to shine the spotlight on the **importance of women's suffrage and the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA)**. Women were not included in the Constitution until the 19th Amendment and the ratification of the 19th Amendment led to the **largest single one-day increase of potential voters** in the history of the United States.

When it comes to **women's fight for equality**, much of this history **resides right here in Fairfax County**. Our schoolbooks rarely mention that the suffragist movement lasted 72 years or include the **story of the scores of suffragists** who were imprisoned in Lorton in 1917 for picketing the White House and demanding the right to vote. These women were **arrested, tried, convicted and imprisoned** for terms up to seven months. They were force-fed, locked in solitary confinement and brutalized. When word leaked out about this unconscionable treatment, **President Wilson was forced to ask Congress to consider a Constitutional Amendment**.

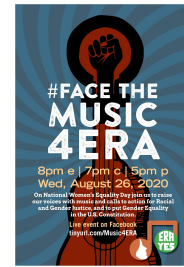
Still there is much work to be done in these areas to **improve the lives of women**. Suffrage was a full-fledged political reform effort that took **five generations of activism and commitment** to achieve. Sadly, though women were written into the Constitution with the right to vote finally in 1920, they **still do not have full equality under the law**. The ERA gives **women and men full equality** under the law. This year, **Virginia's General Assembly finally passed this important legislation**, becoming the 38th and final state needed to ratify the ERA. We are **grateful for the efforts of all the grassroots volunteers of VAratifyERA**, Virginia's nonpartisan, statewide campaign whose singular mission was to put our Commonwealth on the **right side of history** and see the ERA over the finish line. Unfortunately, **many experts and advocates acknowledge legal uncertainty** as to whether the amendment will be ratified.

The **Turning Point Suffragist Memorial Association** has broken ground on a **memorial to women** with 19 education stations in Occoquan Regional Park, but due to COVID-19 and other impediments, it **will not be complete as planned this August**. In recognition of the **100th anniversary of the certification of the 19th Amendment**, **I will be hosting a socially-distanced, masks required, community celebration of the Year of the Woman on August 26, 2020**. Mount Vernon Police Officers Save Lives

In response to a **July midnight call**, Mount Vernon Police District officers responded to a **report of shots fired**. Not knowing what to expect, the first officers on the scene arrived within **two minutes of the 911 call**. Immediately grabbing their **Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC) trauma kits**, entered the apartment building to find the **sight of blood and sound of screaming**. Entering the home, they **found three victims**, one of whom had been **shot three times**. The officers **immediately rendered aid**, calmed emotional family members and learned there might be **victims at another building**.

Additional officers responded to the second building and **found two victims with multiple gunshot wounds**. One officer who is **Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) certified**, determined that one of the gunshot wounds may have **struck the victim's femoral artery** and a second officer immediately **applied a tourniquet** to stop the bleeding, **likely saving the victim's life**. The **officers who responded** to this scene in the middle of the night **did an outstanding job**. Each officer contributed to the **lifesaving measures of all five victims**. They acted **professionally and humanly**, relying on their exceptional training. They have been recommended for the **Fairfax County Police Department's Life Saving Award**. I, personally, **thank them for their service!**

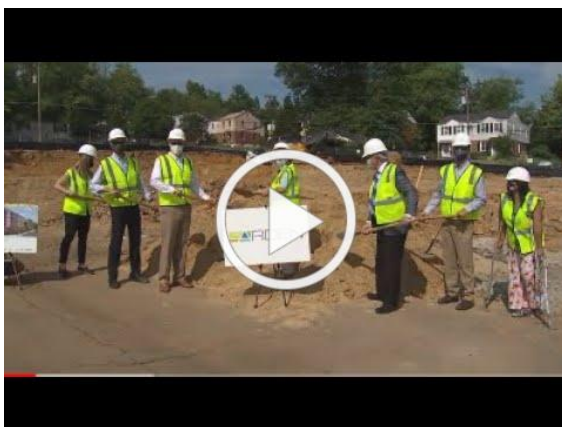

Fairfax County Offering 14 Satellite Absentee Voting Locations this November

The County is **increasing the number** of satellite absentee voting locations. There were nine in-person absentee voting locations for the 2016 election. The change comes after **high demand for absentee voting by mail, which is still strongly encouraged**. A new law has also been enacted in the state of Virginia that **allows "no excuse" to vote absentee**. Previously, you had to provide a reason for not voting in person. 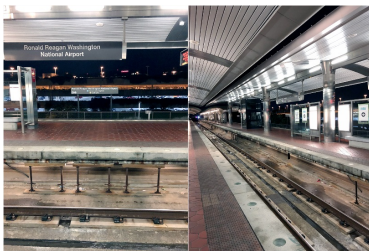
Escalator Replacement Project at Huntington Station

Metro will begin **replacing the south entrance escalators** at Huntington Station beginning **August 19, 2020**. The project, expected to take **approximately five months**, was scheduled to begin next year but will instead be **completed while ridership remains well below pre-pandemic levels and will impact fewer customers**.

During construction, the **south entrance will be closed** to accommodate the heavy equipment needed for site preparation, demolition, construction and installation of the new escalators. [Learn more...](#)

Next Phase of Metro's Covid-19 Recovery Plan

Beginning **Sunday, August 23, Metro will restore approximately 75 percent of Metrobus service** throughout the District of Columbia, Maryland and Virginia as **COVID-19 restrictions are lifted** and **Metro increases capacity** to prepare for the return of customers. 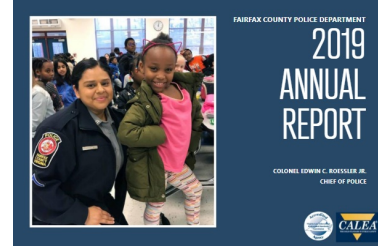

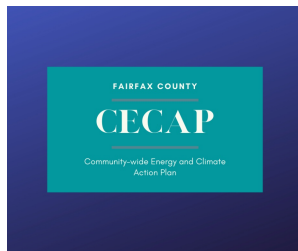


New Animal Cruelty Laws in Effect

Attorney General Mark R. Herring and his **first-in-the-nation Animal Law Unit** have [sent a letter](#) to animal control officers around Virginia **highlighting the new animal cruelty laws** that went into effect last month. The letter also reminds animal control officers that **heat can be deadly to animals**, and that there can be **serious legal consequences** for leaving animals outside **without adequate shelter and water**. The letter outlines the new, **more stringent tethering provisions** and explains that an animal cannot be tied up unless it is **safe from predators** and well suited and **well equipped to tolerate its environment** and may not be tied up under certain conditions. Natural Recycling: Composting Your Food Waste

After you **separate regular recyclables** from your trash, what's left? Much of our trash is **actually food waste**, and that, too, can be recycled by **turning it into compost**. Composting is the **way that nature recycles**. Whether it's the food that's left on a picky eater's plate, to the science experiment in your crisper drawer, **food waste can have a second life**.



The County is promoting a **pilot program** to encourage the **growth of local companies** that collect food waste (also called organics waste) from homes, events, businesses, etc., and turn it into compost. The compost can then be used as a **high-quality soil amendment** in residential backyards, farms, and landscaping projects. [Learn more...](#)

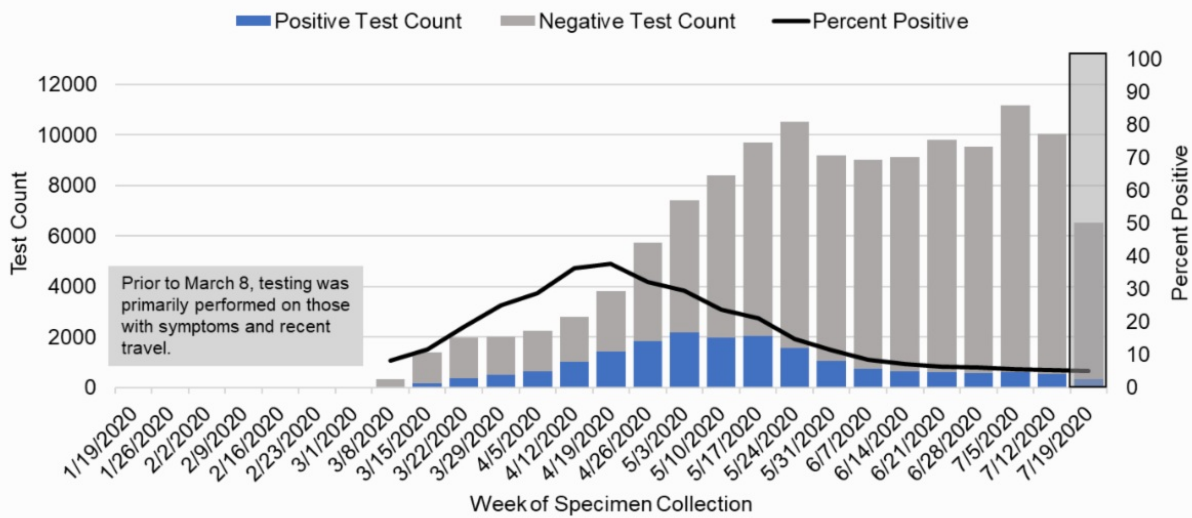

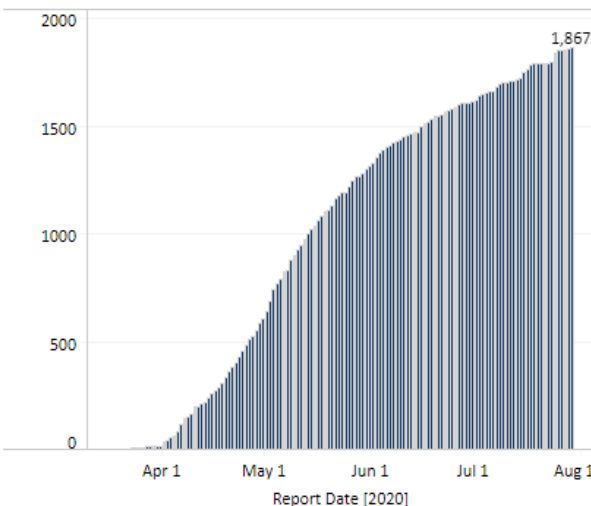
COVID-19 Fairfax Data



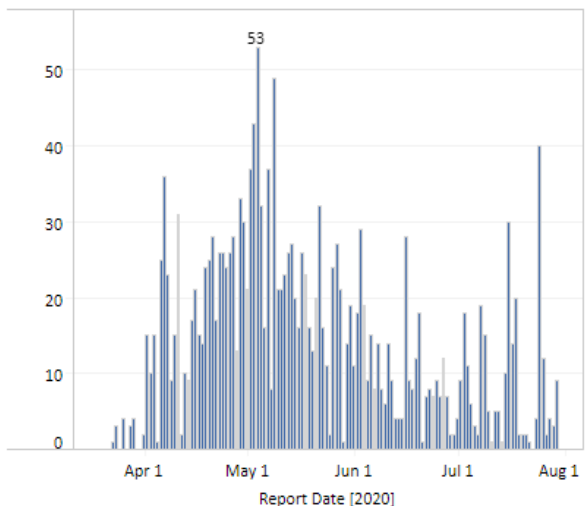
Percentage of Positive Tests

- Status: At least **twelve weeks of a downward trend** has been observed.
- **5.3% of COVID-19 tests were positive** during week of July 12.

Report Date Cumulative - Fairfax

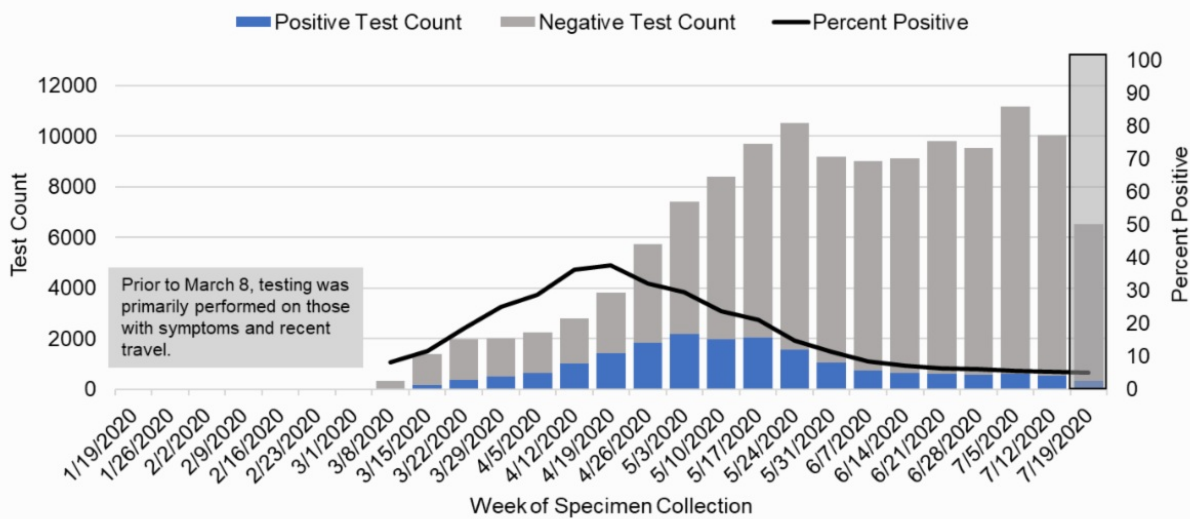


Report Date Daily Count - Fairfax



Hospitalizations

- Status: Since peaking at 53 reported hospitalizations on May 3, **ageneral downward trend has been observed.**
- Several recent single day spikes in hospitalizations are attributable to **retrospective data cleaning** (e.g., After a FCHD interview and **subsequent medical record review** of a hospitalized case, more accurate data was captured).



COVID-19 Testing

- Since early June, total **COVID-19 tests** per week have **generally increased.**
- Previously, this trend was partially hidden by a **backlog of negative test results** that needed to be processed by the Virginia Department of Health.
- During the week of July 12, **10,037 tests were reported.**

Contact Tracing

- On July 20, sufficient staff had been hired and trained to **allow every new COVID-19 case to be investigated**, close contacts traced and actively monitored, and **testing coordinated for symptomatic contacts.**
- **208 of 406 contact tracers have been hired.** Additional staff will continue to be hired and trained to prepare for **possible case count increases** in the fall and winter.

Hospital Beds and ICU Care Capacity

- Overall available hospital beds were at 24%; a **4% decrease from the June 13** report.
- Available **adult critical care beds have been trending downward**, currently at 27% use.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

- **PPE for hospitals** appears to continue to be adequate.

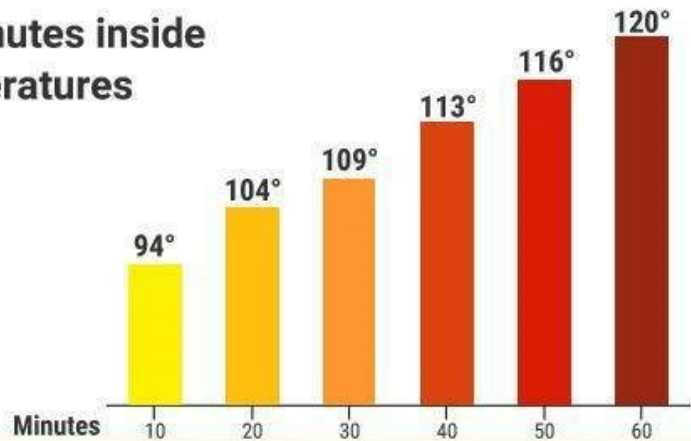
