
#### February 2019

Attendees started the day **connecting with community services**, educational opportunities, local elected officials, friends and neighbors. They were treated to the dulcet tones of the **Harmony Heritage Singers**, special presentations to **former Supervisor Gerry Hyland** and outgoing **Chairman Sharon Bulova**, and a flag waving tribute to our **Federal employees and contractors**. The morning was rounded out with remarks from local leaders on the **State of Mount Vernon**, economic development, Richmond Highway Corridor revitalization and updates on **District schools** and **Fort Belvoir**. Throughout the meeting, those in attendance had the opportunity to **question their local leaders** and were treated to a **virtual tour of the District** at the conclusion.

As some of you may know, February holds a special place in my heart. For the past 25 years, I have had the pleasure of **bringing our American history and democracy to life** through presentations of my favorite president and role model, **Abraham Lincoln**. 

# **Lorton Volunteer Fire Station Demolition Underway**

The **final exterior demolition** of the old Lorton Fire Station began this past Monday. Demolition of the existing **Lorton Volunteer Fire Station #19** began this past fall in preparation for the construction of a



**new 4-bay 23,450 square foot fire station** on the existing footprint. **Training and community space** will also be incorporated into the new building.

### **Airplane Noise Update**

In 2017, the **Federal Aviation Administration** (FAA) agreed to consider **new <u>departure</u> flight patterns** to mitigate the **noise in residential communities** adjacent to the airport. The new departure procedure is **currently in testing**. Once tests are complete, there will be a **phase of public outreach** on any changes. The FAA has had **more difficulty addressing <u>arriving</u> flights** and we are at an impasse on new arrival procedures. This is an issue that I will continue to **push the FAA to resolve**. # **Important Safety Messages**

### **Cold Weather Means Pets Need Adequate Shelter**

With winter in full swing, please remember to **provide your pets with adequate shelter!** Outdoor shelters should be **insulated to keep in warmth** during these cold months. Insulation materials can include **straw, cedar chips or other materials** that do not hold water. **Our pets depend on us** to keep them warm, healthy and happy, so please make sure your shelter is up to par.

#### Adequate shelter means:

- Space should be suitable for each animal, considering species, age, condition, type and size of animal.
- It is safe and protects each animal from weather, injury and direct sunlight.
- Protects from heat and insulated from cold temperatures.
- Has proper lighting and is cleaned regularly.
- Allows for animal to be **clean and dry**, if appropriate for the animal.
- Easily maintained.

### **Urban Soil Health**

Soil is an often forgotten part of the ecosystem but is **extremely important**, **especially for trees**. Components of soil are minerals (sand, silt and clay), air, water and carbon (organic matter). **Healthy soils** are also **teeming with life**, most of which is



microscopic (fungi, bacteria and nematodes). For example, many **tree species rely on soil** fungi called mycorrhizae which help them take up water and nutrients through their roots. Read more...

### **Fairfax-Falls Church Community Services Board**

This Board is responsible for ensuring and overseeing the establishment and operation of local mental health, intellectual disabilities, and substance abuse programs.

#### **Advisory Social Services Board**

The responsibility of this Board is to interest itself in all matters pertaining to the social welfare of the people served by the government; to monitor the formulation and implementation of social welfare programs; to meet with the Director of Social Services at least four times a year for the purpose of making recommendations on policy matters; to make an annual report to the governing body concerning the administration of the public welfare program; and to submit to the governing body other reports that the advisory body deems appropriate.
