

# Help Restore Parkland at Mt. Vernon District Park and Paul Spring Stream Valley Park

Invasive plants prevent us from enjoying our forests and degrade our natural ecosystems. Ever stroll through Mt. Vernon District Park or Paul Spring Stream Valley Park and get stopped by shrubs with thorns or see trees collapsing under the choking hold of heavy vines? They may have been invasive species. Some of them, like multiflora rose and porcelain berry, can completely swarm over a section of woods and block out everything else.



However, **invasives can be thwarted**. The Fairfax County Park Authority has a **volunteer program that battles invasive species**, removing them and **replacing them with native species**.

**Do you live near** Mt. Vernon District Park or Paul Spring Stream Valley Park? Get involved in **protecting your local park** and help create **healthy wildlife habitat**. Volunteer for the **Invasive Management Area program** and become a leader in invasive plant removal. Even a **few hours on a single day** will help. #### **Hunting Creek Tributary at Fairchild Stream Restoration Project**

The transformation of this area from a washed out stormwater pipe runoff area to a well-engineered stream valley is a sight to behold. Instead of an ugly blight destroying our community and washing away natural resources, we now have a lovely, park-like area that residents will enjoy for decades to come. Thank you to the County stormwater management team for the excellent planning, execution and hundreds of plantings to create this new natural area and to preserve the natural springs of Spring Bank! And, a special thanks to resident Martin Tillet and the Spring Bank Community Association for engaging and working with the County on this project.

The project was **substantially complete on January 13, 2021**. Additional landscaping work is scheduled for February 2021, consisting of **live stake trees and shrubs** to be installed along the stream banks. Maintenance mowing of the **newly installed native meadow** will be scheduled during the first few years of meadow establishment, as well as **continued management of non-native invasive plants** throughout the project area. 

#### **County Passes Trust Policy**

Last week, Fairfax County became the **first Virginia jurisdiction** to pass an inclusive **Trust Policy**, which **ends voluntary information sharing and cooperation** with the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) by **all Fairfax agencies including the police**. This action formally adopts a **bng-standing practice** of prohibiting County employees from cooperating with federal immigration agents — a **step aimed at** 

addressing reports that some undocumented immigrants in the County have avoided seeking help during the coronavirus pandemic, out of fear of being deported.

# Police Release Findings Of Speed Study At Richmond Highway Location

Police analyzed the **speed of drivers** at a location on **Richmond Highway**. The study recorded speeds on southbound Richmond Highway (Route 1) at **Belleview Avenue** for six days (Dec. 30 to Jan. 4) and northbound Richmond Highway at **Quander Road** for seven days (Dec. 22 to 28). At the **Belleview Road intersection**, the **highest** 

recorded speed was 86 mph. At the Quander Road intersection, the highest speed was 92 mph. The speed limit for both of these areas is 45 mph. Read more on the Patch...

#### Help Students in Need in the Mount Vernon Area

# **Supporting Our Seniors**

#### Real Estate and Vehicle Tax Relief Extended

The County has **extended the deadline for real estate and vehicle tax relief**. The County's **tax relief program** provides **additional aid to seniors** above the age of 65 and **those who are permanently and totally disabled**. Qualified taxpayers may also be eligible for **tax relief for renters**.

Applicants must **file between January 1, 2021 and May 3, 2021**. Some exceptions may be available if applications are filed late **due to a hardship** which prevented the application from being filed on time.

#### **Senior Citizen Tax Relief Workshops 2021**

Although in-person workshops will not be held for tax year 2021 because of the ongoing health risks caused by COVID-19, the Department of Tax Administration mailed applications to residents in January, which asked residents to sign an affidavit to certify they still are within the program threshold (short form), and return it to DTA. The preferred methods to return completed applications are listed on the application: E-mail at TaxRelief@fairfaxcounty.gov, by fax at 703-802-7595, or first-class mail to: Department of Tax Administration, ATTN: Tax Relief Section, 12000 Government Center Parkway, Suite 225.5, Fairfax, VA 22035-0032. Residents in the program also received a letter with their application that included additional methods available to discuss their application with DTA staff, which include virtual meetings by Zoom video conferencing, and by telephone (703-222-8234; TTY 711). Real estate tax relief is available for older adults and people with disabilities who meet certain qualifications. Qualified residents also may be eligible for car tax and rent relief.
