


Help Plan High Quality Transit Network for Fairfax County

The Fairfax County Department of Transportation is holding a second round of public meetings on the Countywide Transit Network Study. These meetings will be held in an open-house format at two locations within the County, from 6:00 p.m. – 8:30 p.m., with a 20-minute presentation at 7:00 p.m.

The purpose of the Countywide Transit Network Study is to establish the most effective way to serve the County's need to accommodate planned growth over the long term by improving public transit usage. The study will:

- establish an inter connected rapid transit system to meet travel demands through the year 2050;
- define transit corridor functions, modes, station locations, and rights-of-way to guide subsequent comprehensive plan amendments and development review processes;
- identify policies, programs, and actions to support phased implementation and expedite delivery of priority elements in the near term; and
- coordinate with other regional, state, and local jurisdictional plans.

The first steps included stakeholder outreach via two public meetings in July and an online survey with over 1,300 responses. Information on desired goals and objectives, as well as potential transit connections, were collected. Based on this information and an analysis of demand, land use and infrastructure, preliminary network concepts were derived. We welcome public participation as we discuss preliminary transit network concepts and review study alternatives.

Attendees will be invited to participate in facilitated discussions about the initial transit networks selected for analysis and the types of supporting plans and policies that the study should consider.
