

Board Matter

On Dec. 5, 2023, Board directed county staff to evaluate:

- 1) Options for possible prohibition of "high-pressure" gas lines within local street Right-of-Ways based on factors including location, size and type of pipe as well as other operational characteristics; and
- 2) Industry best practices related to safety, installation and location of "high-pressure" gas lines

Natural gas systems and pipelines



Natural gas pipelines and safety

- Design standards per federal safety standards
 - Class locations
 - SMYS
- Transmission lines
- High-pressure distribution lines
- Integrity Management Assessments



Regulating pipeline safety



U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) (Title 49 CFR Part 192)



Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA)



Virginia State Corporation Commission (§ 56-257.2.)

Zoning Ordinance

Fairfax County

Currently exempts distribution gas lines if located in or under street right-of-way from regulation

Other jurisdictions

No other jurisdiction researched prohibits in or under street right-of-way

Enhanced public notice and engagement

Special Exception

Limitations on Location

Enhanced public notice and engagement options



County Code Chapter 2

Require notice and regular engagement with BOS on proposed pipeline replacement/extensions



Agreement/MOU with the Utility

Enhance required Public Awareness Plan for Pipeline Operators and require regular engagement with BOS



Possible Change to State Law

Amend the criteria for SCC public process for certain pipeline projects


Opportunities and challenges - Public notice options

Option	Opportunities	Challenges
Chapter 2 Enhanced public notice and engagement option	Informs community on infrastructure's safety status and notice on future projects	 No authority to require alternate locations
Agreement/MOU Enhanced public notice and engagement option	BOS and utilities to coordinate in developing meaningful public participation tool	 Must be a collaborative approach with both parties consenting to agree to stipulations No authority to require alternate locations
State Code change Enhanced public notice and engagement option	Builds upon established State Code processes for more public notice and participation opportunities	 Timeline for legislative change is lengthy and not guaranteed

Special Exception


Require special exception approval for new high-pressure distribution gas lines located in street rights-of-way

- Require SE for gas lines with specific characteristics, i.e. size, pressure, SMYS
- Consider additional use-specific standards based on locational criteria, i.e. road classification and/or zoning district



Limitation On Location

- Limit installation of high-pressure distribution natural gas lines in certain circumstances or areas
- Determine criteria or locational requirements where they would be prohibited in Zoning Ordinance
 - Pipe characteristics (size of pipe, pressure, SMYS, functionality)
 - Within a specific road classification or zoning district
